What did classmates like most about the reunion?

Reconnecting with classmates and spending time together after all these years was a recurring survey theme. The events of the weekend were praised by many who completed the survey for variety, planning and organization.

The Friday night mixer set the stage:

“It was a huge success getting to see old classmates and friends in an informal setting.”

“Getting to talk with everyone at the mixer on Friday night. Loved the informality of the affair.”

We all especially liked going back to school:

“Loved the tour of BC Central as it is now.”

“The tour of the new additions to BCCHS was a highlight.”

The dinner-dance at the Battle Creek Country Club garnered a lot of praise:

“This was a great selection for the venue.”

“Though I admit that at the outset I was not interested in the dinner, I am so glad I changed my mind. It was great!”

“I spent a lot of time looking at the old photos displayed at the Saturday evening event. It was a super nostalgia trip for me.

Brunch at Clara’s seemed the perfect ending to a wonderful weekend:
